

Isn't that how a community becomes stronger, wiser, and more collaborative?

Carole's leadership on the board of the Illinois Symphony Orchestra has brought us more diverse music, but it has also brought in more diverse sectors from our community. Our community is learning to appreciate the power of music played by a live orchestra due to Carole's efforts. Carole applied her fundraising skills to support the orchestra as well as the BroMenn Foundation for the Mennonite College of Nursing and the Multicultural Leadership Program (MCLP). For many years, Carole has served as a mentor to one MCLP participant each year. She is still friends with many of "her graduates!"

She was the first Executive Director of Illinois Prairie Community Foundation and served on over twelve boards, including, Rotary Club of Bloomington, McLean County Museum of History, Women-to-Women Board, and Friends of the Arts at Illinois State University. She has been recognized for her contributions by many organizations including the Alpha Omicron Pi Alumnae Women of Leadership Award, an Illinois State Board of Education Award of Excellence, the first McLean County YWCA Women of Distinction Award in the Arts, and she was chosen as a founding member of Northwestern University Council of 100, a group of women executives. At Northern, she continues to serve on the Bienen School of Music Advisory Board.

Carole is the epitome of a servant leader. Her decisions, actions, and investments are all focused on making our community a better place to live in all its sectors: art, business, education, and health to name a few. She leads to serve others.







KEYNOTE SPEAKER

ELISABETH WILLIAMS-OMILAMI

Actress, American Human Rights Leader, and CEO of Hosea Helps, Inc.



The daughter of civil rights leaders Hosea and Juanita Williams, Elisabeth played on the steps of their church, as her parents prayed and planned civil rights marches, like Selma, with Martin Luther King, Jr.

Yet, even after King's assassination, her parents continued to work for a better future for their children. Her father decided to start a non-profit called Hosea Helps, to serve the needy. Her mother became one of the first Black women to serve in the Georgia legislature.

As an adult, Elizabeth decided to continue her parents' legacy through theater arts. She is the founder of People's Survival Theater, one of Atlanta's earliest theater companies. She has acted in movies including: The Blind Side, The Ray Charles Story, Selma, The Best of Enemies, Full Count, and many more. She's written plays, including There is a River in My Soul and The Life of a King, which she co-authored with her mother.

Their services were originally focused on food for the hungry, then expanded to finding safe shelter and providing career training. Hosea Helps, which began by serving the needs of Atlanta and Georgia, is now serving the needy throughout the United States and the world.

Elizabeth has been acknowledged and awarded numerous times at state and country-wide levels for her humanitarian services. She was also inducted as an honorary member of the sorority, Zeta Phi Beta.


- Leadership as we transitioned to a virtual program beginning with the class of 2021
